

# The Light at the End of the Tunnel



"The light at the end of the tunnel," is a metaphor used to refer to signs that a long period of adversity is coming to an end. According to <u>Wordorigins.org</u>, the metaphor, if not the exact phrasing, dates to at least 1879 when it appears in a letter by writer George Eliot (Mary Ann Evans) about a recent bout with an illness.

Throughout the Old and New Testament, there are scripture passages of hope that God will come to rescue the people ... from oppression, from war, from calamity, from persecution.

For God will deliver the needy when they cry for help,
The afflicted also, and they who have no helper.
God will have compassion on the poor and needy,
And the lives of the needy God will save.
God will rescue their life from oppression and violence,
And their blood will be precious in God's sight. (Psalm 72:12-14)

For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. (Jeremiah 29:11)

Passages like these have brought hope to people across the centuries, living under all kinds of injustice, suffering from all forms of illness, living through pandemics brought about by people's inhumanity, as well as by bacteria and viruses.

If you pay attention to the news, you will notice many saying "we are now seeing the light at the end of the tunnel." Some are referring to fact that the contentious election is (almost) over, and others to the rolling out of vaccines proven to be effective against COVID-19, and still others to both.

Faith in God, hope in God's intervention, are deeply important. God is good (all the time!), and we are called to trust in God's goodness. But it doesn't end there.

As we enter into the year 2021, after a difficult 2020, with all the revelations of racial inequity and economic injustice and political corruption, it is important to turn again to scripture:

A new heart I will give you, and a new spirit I will put within you; and I will remove from your body the heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh. (Ezekiel 36:26)

If a brother or sister is naked and lacks daily food, and one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill," and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what is the good of that? So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead. (James 2:15-17)



So much work has been done by so many ... for justice, for bringing health and healing, for fairness and honesty in politics, for peace ... but we haven't yet reached the proverbial promised land.

Yes, we can see some light now. There is hope and promise of a new day. Faith in God's goodness matters deeply; trusting in God's goodness matters deeply...and then the work begins.

With renewed hearts and with renewed spirits, we are called to be the hands and feet of God ... to work for equality and justice for all people, to do all we can to heal the earth, the water, the air, to love each other with a deep and wide love, a love which comes from our Creator.

With God's grace, it will be quite a new year!

## **Session Notes**

#### **December Session Report**

The Session and the Board of Deacons met together on December 15 to review the work of the deacons. Co-Moderators Carol Schwalm and Ellen Nurenberger told the Session that the deacons have been making regular contacts with their families, especially during the pandemic while we are not able to meet in person. Families and deacons were matched by the worship service they both usually attended to enable more opportunities for deacons to connect with members. The Session expressed their appreciation for the work of the deacons and Clerk Sara Porter thanked the deacons for their help in gathering information for the annual membership rolls review.

Following the joint meeting, the Session resumed meeting and approved creation of a new restricted fund to receive the donation for a new electronic sign. If there are excess funds upon completion of the project, they will be disbursed to the Capital Project Fund per the donor's request. A task force led by Elder Bruce Gilbert is already working on gathering information needed to move forward on this project.

Funding of up to \$5,000.00 for installation of a fiber optics cable in support of audio/video upgrades was authorized. The Audio/Video task force led by Elder Norman Cobb was also authorized to seek grants to help defray the cost of this project.

On the recommendation of the Safety and Security committee, the Session approved delay of inside worship, church group meetings and any outside groups using the inside facilities until April 10, 2021. This decision enables planning for Ash Wednesday, Lenten worship, Palm Sunday, Holy Week and Easter events.

#### Pastor's Wednesday Evening Bible Study.



#### **Sunday School Class.**





Financial support to ACTS and GPW Health Center is currently being provided on a monthly basis.


# **How to Connect in Live Chat during Worship**

#### How to Connect in Live Chat during Worship

I know we all wish COVID was over so we could worship together in person. Because that won't happen for a while, we will need to continue worshipping online. Did you know that you can connect with others who are also watching the service live? Log in 15 minutes before the service starts (9:45am) and click on the Live Chat icon and chat with others who are watching. It is wonderful to feel that you are not watching alone, and it will also allow you to participate in worship instead of just watching it.

You may be wondering how this is done. It is easy! Just go to the church's web page <a href="https://www.fupcdc.org">www.fupcdc.org</a> and look for the video frame under the heading "Streaming Worship Service Below." You have 2 watch options.

- You can click on the start arrow in the middle of the frame to just watch the service on the church's website, but you will not be able to participate in the Live Chat or leave any Comments, so we encourage to try the 2<sup>nd</sup> option below.
- You can click on the white YouTube icon at the bottom right of the frame to go to YouTube's
  website where you can watch the service and Live Chat, Comment, Like, Share, and
  Subscribe to the church's channel FUPCDC Video.




If Live Chat, Comments, Like, Share and Subscribe are not available to you, it is because you are not signed into the YouTube website, so you will need to do this with a Google Account or Gmail which the site will prompt you to complete. If you do not have a Gmail address, you can create one on the spot for free.



If you already have a Google Account, just Sign In with your Gmail. If you do not already have a Goggle Account, you will need to click on the Create Account in the bottom left and then follow the prompts on the next screen.



The YouTube Home page has many different videos, so you will want to SUBSCRIBE to FUPCDC Video once you are there to make it easy to find the weekly Sunday services. If you have created a new account, and it opens in a YouTube channel other than the FUPCDC Video channel, do one of the following:

- If not Subscribed, go to the Search Box at the top of the page and type in FUPCDC Video and push Enter. It will take you to all the church videos with the most current on top.
- If Subscribed, all you will need to do the next time you want to see a church video is click on the Subscriptions button and it will take you there.

Once you are Signed into YouTube and have returned to the **FUPCDC Video** page, you can do various actions. The screenshot below is not our church channel, but an appropriate clip to show you the locations of the actions such as:

- Live Chat when you are watching a video that is being streamed live. On your computer it will
  be to the right side of your screen. (If you are watching from your phone, click on the Live
  Chat icon that appears right before the Share icon. The Live Chat on your phone will take
  place below the video.) Once the video is no longer live, you will not be able to add to the Live
  Chat, but you can click on Top Chat Replay to read what was chatted during the live
  broadcast.
- Comments (which didn't fit in this screenshot but is directly underneath the indicated red arrow) You may Comment at any time, and your Comments can be seen by anyone who looks at this site.
- Thumbs Up = Like
- Share the Video (We would love to have you pass this on to your friends! ②)
- 5. Subscribe (which is also cut off in this screenshot) This will make it easy for you to find our channel and you will receive notifications when a new video is posted. Just click the red SUBSCRIBE button and you will be subscribed.


We would love to connect with you during livestream worship through Live Chat. Join us 15 minutes before the service begins for general chat where you may be asked an easy conversation starter, and then once the service begins, you can participate in worship by passing the peace, offering virtual prayer requests, and commenting on what you hear. If you have never chatted before, here is how you do it:

- To post in live chat, click into where it says: "Say Something" and begin typing. Then, click the arrow to send it.
- 2. You can respond to someone in the chat feed by mentioning their username.
  - Type "@".
  - Begin typing their username.
  - Select the username.
  - d. The message sender will see their username highlighted in orange, which is visible only to the chatter whom you've mentioned. This makes it easier for them to see your response in the chat feed.
- Viewers are limited to 200 characters and a maximum of 11 submissions every 30 seconds. Event owners are not subject to the frequency threshold. Viewers cannot post special characters, URLs, or HTML tags.

Before you close **FUPCDC Video**, please give a thumbs up and leave a comment of support that will stay attached to this video and can be seen by the public. This will help our church's algorithms, and our videos will be seen by more people who are searching for a church.

We hope this will help you connect to worship in 2021!
