MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ADAM



Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ,

As we are all aware, the global spread of the coronavirus, COVID-19, has become a central topic of discussion and concern for many of us. It has caused us to think about the things we take for granted and to rethink how we go about the practices of our daily lives. In the church, this pandemic has caused us to consider new ways to approach what have been longstanding practices and traditions. We have moved worship to online only Live Streaming, and are learning to meet and gather via video conferencing.

Rather than live in fear, let us together approach this challenge in faith. We have an opportunity to model for our children, for families, for our community, and for each other what a faith-filled and faithful response can be. Instead of living in panic and in fear, being reactionary and taking a self-centered response, we have a chance to remain rational and reasoned, and to approach this pandemic in a spirit of trust. For we know that God is sovereign and Lord of all things. As Colossians 1:17 says, "He himself is before all things, and in Him all things hold together."

We should be concerned. The coronavirus is real. But we cannot and we will not be afraid. We are the Church and, together, we belong to Christ.

Session Notes

March Session Report

The Session met in the sanctuary on March 17 with individual tables spread six feet apart. There were ten members present plus one elder connected electronically. Appropriate health-care measures were taken.

The Session approved closing the building to all in person worship, programs, events and activities beginning March 18, 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic until the Safety and Security team in concert with authorized government officials deem it safe and prudent for the welfare of the community to meet in person again. Pastor Adam and Kim can be reached by phone or email If you need to communicate with them.

The March 15 worship services were live streamed and worship services will be live streamed at 10 AM Sunday mornings while the building is closed. Check the church web site for links to connect or to view prior services.

The Session, Session committees and team meetings of the church are authorized to make use of electronic meetings (E-meetings) to continue the business of the church. Other groups such as Bible studies may also use this technology. This ability to meet electronically will continue after the closing as needed. The Session approved a policy for electronic voting when needed.

The Session approved \$350.00 for a Women's Retreat and authorized payment of the church's lawyer retainer fees.

The Session approved insertion of a contracts section into the church's Personnel Policy.

Easter Flowers





