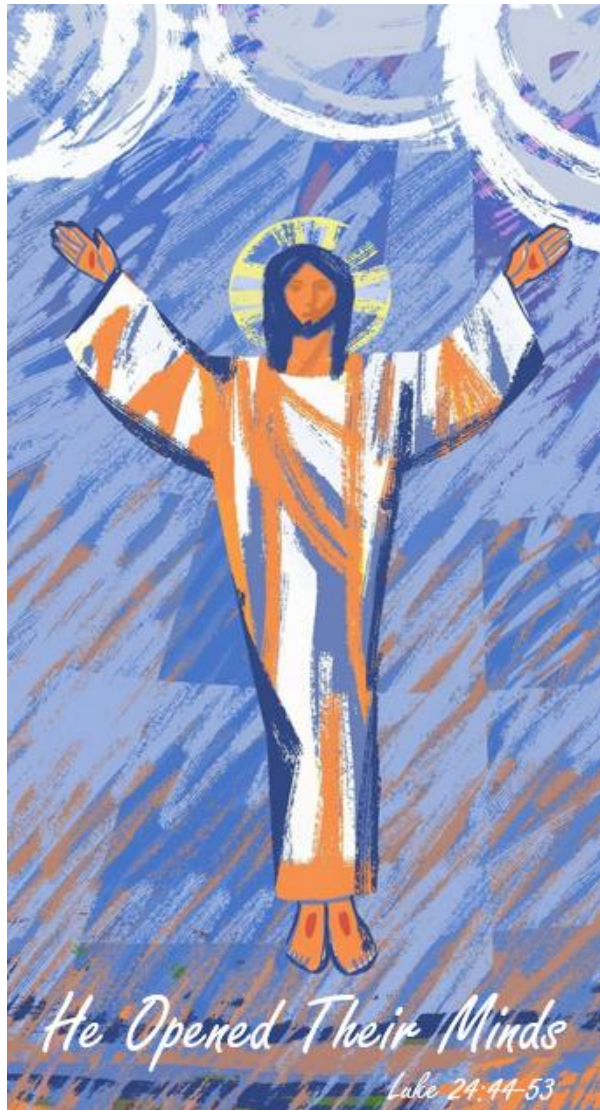

## Rev. Landon Whitsitt

The Rev. Landon Whitsitt joined The Synod of Mid-America (SoMA) as its Synod Executive in 2011. He also served as its Stated Clerk from 2011 to 2019.

He is a graduate of Louisville Presbyterian Theological Seminary, and before entering the pastorate was a member of Session at First Presbyterian Church in Lawrence, KS, served in campus ministry, and was the music director for a new church development. He was ordained as the Program Director for The Center for Interfaith Relations in Louisville, KY before accepting a call to First Presbyterian Church in Liberty, MO (Heartland Presbytery).

From 2008 to 2012, Landon served on the PCUSA Committee on Theological Education, and in July 2010, he was confirmed as Vice-Moderator of the 219th General Assembly of the PCUSA for a two year term. From 2012-2014, he was a member of the General Assembly's Mid Council Commission, and served on the board of the Presbyterian Mission Agency from 2012 to 2018. He currently is co-moderator of the General Assembly Family Leave Task Force.



Programmatically, the most visible part of Landon's work is Theocademy (<http://www.theocademy.com/>), high quality free videos for all stages of faith development.

## RULING ELDERS: THE MINISTRY OF DISCERNMENT & GOVERNANCE

As there were in Old Testament times elders for the government of the people, so the New Testament church provided persons with particular gifts to share in discernment of God's Spirit and governance of God's people. Accordingly, congregations should elect persons of wisdom and maturity of faith, having demonstrated skills in leadership and being compassionate in spirit. Ruling elders are so named not because they "lord it over" the congregation (Matt. 20:25), but because they are chosen by the congregation to discern and measure its fidelity to the Word of God, and to strengthen and nurture its faith and life. Ruling elders, together with teaching elders, exercise leadership, government, spiritual discernment, and discipline and have responsibilities for the life of a congregation as well as the whole church, including ecumenical relationships. When elected by the congregation, they shall serve faithfully as members of the session. When elected as commissioners to higher councils, ruling elders participate and vote with the same authority as teaching elders, and they are eligible for any office.<sup>2</sup>
