From Pastor Adam



I know many of you are wondering, "When are we gathering together again in person?" That's a really great question. I know that you want to know that. Everyone who bumps into me at the gas station or around town wants to know that. Even my own family wants to know that.

The Safety and Security Committee and our Session are trying to make the very best decision we can during this difficult season. We appreciate those of you who took the time to fill out the COVID-19 survey, and we want you to know that your feedback was helpful. I want you to know that we have been in contact with people from the local, state, and federal government, people who are associated with the school system, local businesses, and our Presbytery for guidance. **We want to make sure, first and foremost, that we keep our church family safe.**

We also want to make our worship experience meaningful and transformative. We don't want you to come to church in person and have it to be weird. I say that because I have talked to other pastors and churches, who have opened their buildings maybe just a bit prematurely. Their feedback to me is that it has been really weird. During this pandemic, churches won't be able to sing together in person (science says this is super dangerous), pass the peace or hug. Folks will need to wear masks and sit six feet apart. It will be unsafe to say things, like the Lord's prayer or the prayer of confession, in unison. When we return to in person worship, we will not be able to go back to the worship experience that we know and love—at least not until there is a vaccine for COVID-19—so we are in no rush.

One of the things that God has laid on my heart, as I have been working with the Session and praying about this, is that we have always been a church for everyone. Our desire at FUPCDC is to be an inclusive church. We want you to bring your friends and then bring their friends. Bring your enemies, and maybe they will become your friends.

What we do know for sure right now is that we will not be doing in person worship gatherings and the church building will remain closed through August 16, 2020. We will continue to reassess this, as we receive more information. If something changes, we will let you know as soon as possible.

We will continue to have online worship (with virtual communion the first Sunday of each month) each Sunday at 10:00 AM until further notice. We hope that you will invite folks to join us via their computer, smart phone, or tablet for worship at www.fupcdc.org.

I thank you for your continued support, prayers, and your willingness to try new things as we navigate what it means to be the church "for such a time as this." Please don't hesitate to email, call, or text me if you have any prayer needs or concerns.

Session Notes

June Session Report

At its June Meeting the Session approved a Safety and Security committee recommendation that the church doors will remain closed and on-line worship continue through August 16, 2020. The building will remain closed to all groups through this time. The committee will review any requests outside these parameters and also reassess the August date as we draw closer.

At the request of the music staff and the Worship committee, the Session approved a praise and worship outdoor concert scheduled for June 27 at 7:30 PM. This will be a drive-in event, with cars leaving a space between them and the next car. The building will still be closed, and people attending must remain in their cars. There will be no lawn seating. In case of rain, the event will be canceled.

The contract for Little Hands Preschool director, Tiffany Ramsey, was approved. She is working on plans for the Little Hands 2020-2021 school year, working with Safety and Security and awaiting decisions from the Prince William County Public Schools as LHP follows their calendar and many of their decisions will impact LHP. As always, tell your friends and neighbors with preschool age children about our wonderful preschool.

Drama Camp and Bible Camp are combining this year for a Staycation virtual camp with the theme of "Sharing God's Gifts and Talents." Check the church's web site and Facebook page for registration and more information. Best of all, it is free! Members of the congregation are invited to share their gifts with the campers. Contact Ruth Washburg or Pastor Adam if you are willing to help. And spread the word—since it is on-line, children do not have to be here in Woodbridge to participate. The camp is for rising first-graders through rising ninth-graders.

Lastly, Session approved an amendment to the church's operating procedures to allow for electronic congregational meetings and voting.

Through your special donations to help fill the needs of ACTS Hunger Prevention Center we were able to send \$3,495. This was in place of the non perishable food and household items we donate on a regular basis by dropping them in the cabinet in the Narthex Welcome Center. In addition, a \$1,000 was sent to support ACTS programs. ACTS programs include the Hunger Prevention Center, services for victims of Domestic Violence, emergency assistance with utility bills, a crisis helpline, and calls to check in with seniors. Last year we established a relationship with Lake Ridge Fellowship House, an apartment community for low income seniors and those with disabilities. We continue to provide support through donations of groceries and personal care items for the residents to have in their closet. The closet is on the honor system and residents are free to take what they need.




FUPCDC Contemplative Yoga Classes Continue Online This Summer!
