

When they had found out, they said, "Five, and two fish." ³⁹ Then he ordered them to get all the people to sit down in groups on the green grass. 40 So they sat down in groups of hundreds and of fifties. 41 Taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven, and blessed and broke the loaves, and gave them to his disciples to set before the people; and he divided the two fish among them all. 42 And all ate and were filled; 43 and they took up twelve baskets full of broken pieces and of the fish. 44 Those who had eaten the loaves numbered five thousand men.

Larry was raised in Baltimore, Maryland, the third of six children. After graduating from Gordon College in 1975 with a B.A in History, he attended Fuller Theological Seminary, graduating with a Master of Divinity in 1978. There he met and married Amy, his wife of 40 years. In 1982, he was ordained as a minister in the former United Presbyterian Church (USA), and served as the solo pastor of the Presbyterian Church of Plumville, Pennsylvania, for four years. In 1986 he was commissioned as a Lt(jg) in the United States Navy Chaplain Corps. Over a 27-year career, he served the Navy, Marine Corps, and Coast Guard in a variety of billets, both afloat and ashore. He retired from the Navy in 2013, then moved to Woodbridge, Virginia, where he and Amy now live. He served as a civilian facilitator for the Navy's CREDO program for one year, designing and conducting marriage enrichment retreats. In 2014, he accepted the position of Director of the Presbyterian Council for Chaplains and Military Personnel and served for three years before retiring from active ministry in 2017.

RULING ELDERS: THE MINISTRY OF DISCERNMENT & GOVERNANCE

As there were in Old Testament times elders for the government of the people, so the New Testament church provided persons with particular gifts to share in discernment of God's Spirit and governance of God's people. Accordingly, congregations should elect persons of wisdom and maturity of faith, having demonstrated skills in leadership and being compassionate in spirit. Ruling elders are so named not because they "lord it over" the congregation (Matt. 20:25), but because they are chosen by the congregation to discern and measure its fidelity to the Word of God, and to strengthen and nurture its faith and life. Ruling elders, together with teaching elders, exercise leadership, government, spiritual discernment, and discipline and have responsibilities for the life of a congregation as well as the whole church, including ecumenical relationships. When elected by the congregation, they shall serve faithfully as members of the session. When elected as commissioners to higher councils, ruling elders participate and vote with the same authority as teaching elders, and they are eligible for any office.²
