

INDOOR WORSHIP: Masks are encouraged (for age 2 and up), but not required for vaccinated individuals. Masks are required for unvaccinated individuals age 5 and up. N95 masks are encouraged for people in vul-

nerable populations. Both services will also be live streamed for those who choose to worship at home.

NURSERY: The church nursery will open **Sunday, August 1** to children (infant through 4 years old) on a reservation basis for the 8:30 AM and 11:00 AM worship services. All nursery staff and volunteers are vaccinated against COVID-19, and spots will be limited to keep class sizes small. Masks are recommended for ages 3 and up, but not required. Please do not place your child in the nursery if they have a fever, cough, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea, or other symptoms of illness. Please do not place your child in the nursery if they have been exposed to someone who is COVID-19 positive in the past 14 days. We will also be doing temperature checks for those attending the church nursery and for staff. The registration link is on the church website.

Attendance and Prayer Requests

Since we have temporarily suspended passing the friendship register, we request that those who attend worship in person sign in at one of the new attendance stations. If you are worshiping from home, or don't feel comfortable signing in at a station, you can register your attendance and prayer requests using the online form, which is located on our website at fupcdc.org/attend or by scanning the QR Code with your mobile device.

Session Notes

July Session Report

At its meeting on July 22, the Session welcomed Amanda Peck as a new Friend of the Church. Amanda is a friend of the Bowling family and has been attending our virtual worship services.

An additional Ultraviolet HVAC installation was approved for the nursery cooling/heating zone. Previous Ultraviolet air purifiers were installed in the sanctuary area and the preschool area.

Reports were received from the ministry teams, the Director of Little Hands Preschool and the Treasurer. Our finances are in good shape and our viewership of the online worship services continues at about the same level as before opening to in-person worship. Our hybrid services are meeting the spiritual needs of a diverse congregation.

Elder Sam Parris was appointed as President of the First United Presbyterian Church of Dale City, Virginia, Incorporated. The current Session members are the trustees and the Clerk of Session is the Secretary.

The Session spent some time in reading a portion of "Habits of Evangelism," material from the PC(USA), and discussing what evangelism is and is not. As a Matthew 25 church, reaching out to others is a part of our focus, and this study by the Session will help to define and plan our focus on reaching out to our community and beyond. Session will be spending several months working through this material. You may contact Pastor Adam if you would like to know more about what evangelism is.




Growing in Faith (Christian Education)

NEW MINISTRY

Jessica Dunn, the Executive Director of *Change In Action* was one of the speakers in the Fair Share Speaker Series a few months back. After learning about the organization, the Mission Team reached out to learn more about their needs. The mission of *Change in Action* is to promote safe and stable violence-free lives by teaching skills, modeling and instilling accountability, educating on the health consequences of exposure to trauma, and supporting individuals and families through the process of change to enhance personal well-being through the development of healthy relationships. The organization has 3 programs:

- ♦ Batterer's Intervention
- Anger Management
- ♦ Children's Program

We are supporting the Children's Program by providing funding for backpacks and school supplies for children with difficult home environments.



On July 28, 2021, with the help of your generous donations, gift bags filled with family games and activities were donated to 12 families, (a total of 37 children). Additionally, 20 incentive/reward gifts were donated to the Good Shepherd Housing Partnership Program for individuals who receive their services. Gift bags contained age appropriate books, puzzles, and games for each family. Incentive/reward gifts consisted of water bottles and a small gift card from local fast food restaurants. The Good Shepherd Housing Partnership Program began in January 2002 and is designed to meet an urgent need for longer term supportive, affordable housing for Prince William County families earning very low incomes. The families come from shelters, transitional housing programs, or are in imminent danger of homelessness.

This program also provides a wide range of supportive services. The goals of this program are to empower families to retain housing through educational and income development and to provide parents with the support necessary to help their children achieve their highest, personal best.


