From Pastor Adam

"Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith . . ."

~ Hebrews 12:1-2



Perseverance. This word calls to mind other words like strength, courage, resilience, good old-fashioned stick-to-itiveness. It means that we "keep on keeping on" to borrow a phrase from the 1960's. Many of you are people who have persevered throughout your lives. You have made it through cancer and chemotherapy. You have made it through the loss of parents and partners and even children. 

Session Notes

August Session Report

At the August 18 meeting, the Session approved the recommendation of the Safety and Security committee that the church building remain closed to church and outside groups meeting until October 31, 2020. They also approved a motion that anyone planning to use the outside property for their groups must submit a detailed plan to Safety and Security that follows the committee guidelines. These guidelines include wearing of appropriate masks, social distancing, length of the event (3.5 hours or less including setup and tear-down) and no overnight events. This applies to both church and outside groups. The application is available from the church office.

The baptism of Sadie Schick, daughter of Emily and Robert Schick and granddaughter of Ellen and Robert Nuern-berger was approved for Sunday, September 20. It will take place during an outdoor drive-in worship service. Only the family and Pastor Adam will be on the lawn for the baptism. This service is a part of new opportunities for worship approved by the Worship committee and Session. The worship for September 6 will be live-stream only and will include virtual communion.

On Sunday, September 13 and Sunday, September 20, there will be a drive-in worship at the church parking lot with appropriate distancing and sound via AM radio. You will need to be within 150 feet of the church to receive the AM radio broadcast. The live-stream via YOU Tube will be available as usual from the web site links. Sunday, September 27 will be live-stream from the web site as usual. Of course, in case of inclement weather on September 13 and 20, the drive-in worship portions will be canceled and there will be notification through social media.

At the recommendation of the Finance and Administration committee, Session approved changes in the Congregational Connections and Adult Christian Education committees to reflect changes in their ministry plans.

Dear Friends,

In the book of Acts, the story of Pentecost tells of the amazing way the Holy Spirit pulled together a fragmented and frightened group of Jesus' followers, resting on them and filling them with fresh ways to speak the good news of God's love. The story is told in a way that reminds believers of the old story of the tower of Babel in Genesis, where the unity and common purpose of humanity was shattered through pride, misunderstanding and confusion. It was a disaster that shattered human community. I am thinking today how those old stories resonate in new ways during this strange season of the COVID-19 pandemic. In the U.S. and across the globe, people have found common purpose and demonstrated nobility in the face of threat, serving others and preserving life, even while others have allowed fear and crisis to diminish their own humanity and harm the common good. It was, as Dickens once penned, the best of times and the worst of times.

Yet, I am also filled with gratitude for the ways this new moment of Pentecost is also unfolding, as good news is demonstrated, transcending differences of language, culture and race, through the gifts, prayers, and diligent work of so many in the Presbyterian family. Since the middle of March, PDA has been able to put two million dollars into the field to respond to COVID-19, grants made possible by faithful gifts over the last few years to the general fund of Presbyterian Disaster Assistance. In the U.S., congregations receiving small grants from PDA have expanded the operations of existing food banks and opened new ones. Even while not meeting for in person worship, they have reached out a hand to those in their neighborhoods living without shelter, established new relationships with communities living on the margin, refugees, and people whose lack of access to clean water makes sanitation practices challenging, if not impossible. Our international partners are doing much the same, across the globe, and in addition to emergency food, sanitation, water and shelter, are providing awareness and sensitization campaigns in areas too remote for a strong governmental or regional approach and offering spiritual care along with tangible resources. And even as COVID-19 dominates our thoughts, resources and common life, tornados, typhoons, fires and floods still work devastation...and PDA is still showing up and helping. Through all of these communities at work in local response to the pandemic, and in your continued commitment to ongoing disaster response, you have spoken the language of love in a tangible, impactful way, offering a gift that helps to bring renewed hope and joy to those individuals and communities suffering from disaster and its aftermath. On their behalf, thank you.

Please know that your gift of \$1,000 on 6/8/2020 to DR999999 Disaster Relief--International Disasters & Emergencies blesses those who walk the hard road toward recovery, letting them know they are not alone, helping them to find hope in the midst of chaos, and making real the promise of Pentecost—the tangible demonstration of the "mighty acts of God" in healing and restoration...in the language each one needs most to hear.
