Session Notes

August Session Report

At the August 26 meeting, the Session approved Elder Pat Manalio as the Interim Team Leader for the Administration Ministry Team. Fred Menke was approved as the Assistant Clerk of Session to fill in taking minutes when the Clerk is not available and to assist in reviewing the Session record books in preparation for the annual presbytery evaluation.

Tiffany Ramsey, Director of Little Hands Preschool (LHP), reported that 40 students are enrolled and that the staff has been preparing for opening on August 30. They have cleaned and sanitized, prepared their rooms for students and held "Meet And Greet" visits with students and their parents. LHP is still looking for a teacher assistant two days a week as well as parent and church member volunteers (various opportunities in the morning during school hours).

Session approved new procedure for assembling budget requests reflecting our change in organization. Budget requests will come from the Ministry Teams and reflect their priorities in allocating funds within their ministries. A Budget Task Force made up of the Treasurer, the Stewardship and Finance Ministry Team Leader, the Pastor and two Elders will review and prioritize the overall budget. When the final budget is ready, aligned with results of the annual stewardship campaign, it will be presented to the Session for approval.

The Session spent time discussing Radical Welcoming, one of the Eight Habits of Evangelism, the Session's focus for this year. They talked about who are the members of our congregation, who are we missing, and how we might welcome and include them in worship and activities.




Adult Education Classes

As summer comes to close and we start preparing for fall, we are excited to resume with our Sunday classes. We have an exciting agenda lined up for the fall!




Romans Bible Study


Horizons (Ladies' Bible Study)


