From Pastor Adam



O holy night! The stars are brightly shining, It is the night of our dear Savior's birth. Long lay the world in sin and error pining, Till He appeared and the soul felt its worth. A thrill of hope, the weary world rejoices, For yonder breaks a new and glorious morn. Fall on your knees! O hear the angel voices! O night divine, O night when Christ was born.

Are you tired? Already tired...and it's just the beginning of "The Holidays." It's been an altogether different kind of year: masks, isolation, divisions in our nation, fear of the future...

It makes us weary.

You could even say that being weary and worn out is an acceptable place from which to approach this Advent season. Advent exists to remind us that, while darkness surrounds us and troubles exist, the hope of Christmas isn't far away.

It may seem distant. It may even seem impossible this year for you to feel hopeful. You might have lost your job. Or, maybe you're feeling isolated from those you love. You may have even grieved the loss of a family member or friend.

Looking around, all you might be able to see right now is darkness. You try to adjust your eyes, blinking into the night, yet there seems to be no light. The weight of sickness, death, injustice, and pain seems too heavy.

Or, maybe you're just tired. Numb. Are you ready to pull the covers over your head and try this whole Christmas cheer thing again next year? Don't feel guilty. Instead, acknowledge the very real darkness of this world and you'll have eyes to see Advent through the same lens as the people waiting for a Messiah thousands of years ago.

It had been 500 years since the people of Israel had heard anything from God about their redeemer. God's chosen people must have cried out to Him, asking how long it would be before their hope, their salvation, would arrive. It was dark, and God seemed to be silent. Has God seemed silent to you this year?

Though God may have seemed far away to them, God was so much closer than His people knew—lovingly planning Jesus' entrance into the world in the most unexpected way.

This Advent, I encourage you to journey with your church family through this season of expectant and prayerful waiting, by using our 2020 Advent Devotional Booklet, found on our church website. This devotional booklet was written entirely by members of our church family. Special thanks to Charlotte Stultz, our 2020 Advent Devotional Coordinator, and Kim Parker, our Office manager, for making this dream become a reality for a second year in a row.

To me, nothing is more exciting than the fact that the people who contributed to this devotional booklet are the same people who are gathering together virtually each Sunday to worship our Lord and Savior from their homes. They are our friends and neighbors, our brothers and sisters in Christ. I hope and pray that using this devotional booklet will become a treasured part of your Advent season.

Like last year, this is a traditional daily devotional booklet with scripture and thoughts for each day of the week starting the 1st Sunday of Advent, November 29. Each day's devotional will take less than five minutes to read, and I know that it will be a blessing to you. If you have never done anything like this before, I encourage you to take up this spiritual discipline of reading scripture and spending time with our Lord each day. I think you will be surprised by the results! Also, if you are technologically challenged, or just like to hold paper in your hands, please contact the church office and we can arrange a safe and socially distanced pick up for you.

In all the jumble, stress, and even hurt during these weeks ahead, the Advent truth of our daily readings reminds us that, "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light." (Isaiah 9:2) We are reminded that we are a people who have "a thrill of hope" because God did not leave us to wallow in the darkness, but instead has sent His son, the Light of the World, to make all things right. Yes, friends, "for yonder breaks a new and glorious morn." That is our Advent hope, and it gives us the peace that passes all understanding, a joy that is indescribable, and a love that is eternal. I pray that you, in your weariness, have a holy and meaningful Advent this year, as you reflect upon this truth.

Session Notes

November Session Report:

At the stated Session meeting on November 24, the Session certified the results of the November 8 Congregational Meeting in which the Pastor's salary and benefits package was approved. The vote was 84 yes votes and 1 no vote.

They also certified the results of an electronic vote by Session to approve the Un-Trim-A-Tree program as a fund-raiser. The vote was 13 yes votes, all of those voting.

Gary Smith was elected to a one-year term as Treasurer of the congregation and Sara Porter was elected to a one-year term as Clerk of Session. The Finance and Administration committee was approved to reset the church's budgeted goals and to reallocate funding as required for the 2021 calendar year.

An anonymous family has pledged the funds to replace our current outdoor sign with an electronic sign. A task force headed by Bruce Gilbert, with members Bob Chamberlin, Gaylene Guest, Joe Willever, Diane Fulton and Rick Mitchell was approved by the Session. This process will take at least a year due to all of the county regulations and processes to be completed.


A task force to research and recommend upgrades to the church's audio/visual capabilities led by Norman Cobb with Chris Martin, Colin MacKenzie, Marti Hall, Mike Gundel and Cathy Albrecht was approved at the November 10 called Session meeting.

The Christmas Joy offering will be collected on Christmas Eve. Checks or electronic designated giving should be marked "Christmas Joy" and can be sent now through December 31, 2020.

Finally, the Personnel committee was authorized to issue staff contracts for 2021.



Pastor's Wednesday Evening Bible Study:



Sunday School Class:







Each resident at *Lake Ridge Fellowship House*, a community for low-income seniors, received a small fruit basket during the week of Thanksgiving. The sincere appreciation that was shown when we delivered the baskets was amazing and made it clear that we are *Impacting Lives* at this community.

The Blanket Drive, normally held on Christmas Eve, is cancelled this year. Those who we support with this effort are currently being housed in the Ferlazzo Building so the blankets are not needed at this time. As there is an urgent need for food in Prince William County we encourage you to donate healthy, non-perishable food to the ACTS Hunger Prevention Center. North American Aerospace Defense Command (NORAD) Tracks Santa

24 hours a day, 365 days a year, NORAD tracks everything that flies in and around North America in defense of our homelands. On Dec. 24, they have the very special mission of also tracking Santa.

NORAD has been tracking Santa since 1955 when a young child accidently dialed the unlisted phone number of the Continental Air Defense Command (CONAD) Operations Center in Colorado Springs, Colorado, believing she was calling Santa Claus after seeing a promotion in a local newspaper.

Air Force Colonel Harry Shoup, the commander on duty that night, was quick to realize a mistake had been made, and assured the youngster that CONAD would guarantee Santa a safe journey from the North Pole.

Thus a tradition was born that rolled over to NORAD when it was formed in 1958. Each year since, NORAD has dutifully reported Santa's location on Dec. 24 to millions across the globe.

Thanks to the services and resources generously provided by numerous corporate contributors and volunteers, NORAD Tracks Santa has persevered for more than 60 years.

Though the program began due to a misdialed number, NORAD Tracks Santa has flourished and is recognized as one of the Department of Defense's largest community outreach programs.

Each year, the NORAD Tracks Santa Web Site receives nearly fifteen million unique visitors from more than 200 countries and territories around the world. Volunteers receive more than 130,000 calls to the NORAD Tracks Santa hotline from children around the globe.

This year, children and the young-at-heart are able to track Santa through Facebook, Twitter, YouTube and Instagram.
