#### **CLUB 143 CHILDREN'S CHURCH:**

Love is the basis for **Club 143**, a tribute to Mister Rogers's legacy. The number 143 was very important to Fred Rogers. He was faithful to swim every day, except Sundays. For the last thirty years of his life, he was careful to maintain his weight at 143 pounds. But the number had another meaning to him. Rogers said, "It takes one letter to say 'I' and four letters to says 'love' and three letters to say 'you." One hundred and forty-three.



Children in **grades K-2** will have an opportunity to attend **Club 143** after the Time for Children in the 11:00 AM worship service. Children who wish to attend, will go to Room 4 to study scripture and respond to that Bible story with a craft, game, or other activity. Children in grades 3 and up are asked to stay in

worship as active participants. If children in grades 3 and up would like to participate in worship leadership, please contact Pastor Adam!

# GOD AND CHURCH YOUTH GOD AND CHURCH CLASS:

Youth in grades 6-12 are invited to participate in the **God and Church Class**. This class is for **ALL YOUTH**, male and female, grades 6 through high school seniors. We will be using the God and Church curriculum. All students will receive a special award when they complete the program, and scouts (Boy Scouts & Girl Scouts) may have their accomplishment recognized by their Scout group.

The God and Church curriculum is designed to lead youth on a three-part faith journey.

#### Class Goals:

- To strengthen young people's relationship with Christ
- To challenge young people to learn about and participate in the worship and ministry of the church
- To have young people make a plan for daily Bible reading and memorize a creed, or statement of belief, and/or passage of scripture.
- To provide the opportunity for young people to experience the joy of serving others

The three parts of the faith journey will be: meeting Jesus, worshiping God, and witnessing and ministering for Christ. Young people will have the opportunity to work with youth leaders and Pastor Adam as they study the church's structures and objectives, and participate in service projects that will give them a better understanding of the mission of the First United Presbyterian Church of Dale City.

At the August Session meeting, we approved the calendar for the next program year and several fundraising and donation requests submitted by the Stewardship committee.

An Eagle Scout project to remove the unused amphitheater in order to make the area available for future projects was approved.

We approved \$1,000.00 for a ramp outside the sanctuary side door in order to be ADA compliant.

The updated Personnel policy was approved.

Waivers to the Little Hands Preschool teacher employment policy on a one-time basis and to the class enrollment policy were also approved.

Rebecca "Becca" Washburg has been nominated to the Presbytery nominating committee for consideration to be a Youth Advisory Delegate to the PC(USA) General Assembly to be held in Baltimore in June of 2020. If chosen and elected by the presbytery, Becca would represent the presbytery at the General Assembly meeting while also learning more about how our denomination works.

Also, through the Worship committee, the blue hymnals have been given to Milford Presbyterian Church of Milford, Delaware. a member of their church picked them up in August. We are glad to know that they are continuing to be used in worship by another congregation.




#### HORIZONS WOMEN'S BIBLE STUDY

"GRIEF AND LOSS: WHERE ARE YOU?"

REVEREND JUANITA STOKES, MA, Licensed Professional Counselor

SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 21, 7:00 PM AT THE CHURCH

Reverend Juanita Stokes will give the Fair Share Presentation on September 21 entitled "Grief and Loss: Where Are You?" Reverend Stokes is a Licensed Professional Counselor in Virginia and Washington D.C. with the Center for Pastoral Counseling and she has an office here in Woodbridge.

Counseling and Ministry are second careers for Reverend Stokes. She is a retired State Department High Level Manager and has an excellent understanding of workforce issues. Juanita takes a holistic approach to counseling, addressing mental and spiritual health issues and honoring the individuality and uniqueness of each client.

Her clientele varies in age from adolescent through adult. Reverend Stokes counsels couples and families who present clinical issues including Anxiety and Depression, Adjustment, PTSD, Grief and Loss, Behavioral, Spiritual, Substance Abuse, Communication, Anger and other life issues.

Grief and loss is multi-faceted and not just feelings we experience when a loved one passes away. During our lives we can encounter grief and loss in a variety of situations. Reverend Stokes personally journeyed through grief and made her own discoveries along the way. Come and hear her story!

#### **MEN'S RETREAT**

Psalm 91:7 says that "a thousand may fall at your side, ten thousand at your right hand, but it will not come near you."

On Saturday, September 28, the men of the church are invited to gather at Rick Bockes' farm from 2-6 PM for a time of fellowship and Bible study.
