Happy New Year! (Well, liturgically speaking, that is.) Before you think that somebody needs to buy the new pastor a calendar, let me explain. I am writing to you, the congregation, to talk to you about Advent. Yes, Advent, the season of the church year that marks the beginning of a new liturgical year for the church. Advent, derived from the Latin word *adventus*, means "coming" or "arrival." The secular, commercial world would like us to think that Advent begins in September, when the first Christmas decorations and displays appear in stores. Advent actually begins Sunday, December 2 this year, and it is meant as a time of waiting and pondering, especially about the coming of Jesus to earth.

I know that you are experts at waiting, for you have already waited for quite a while for the new pastor to arrive on the scene. Guided by Pastor Jeri, you prepared for my arrival by doing a congregational study, forming a Pastor Nominating Committee, writing a ministry information form, praying, writing new policies, and commissioning a new hymnal. Yes, the waiting for the new pastor to arrive was a lot of work, and it has finally ended—Praise the Lord! Know that I am so very excited to begin our journey together as we worship and serve God in Dale City.

However, that journey begins with more waiting and more preparation, this time for something far greater than a new pastor. In Advent, we wait and prepare for the coming of our Emmanuel, or God with us, in Jesus Christ. So, how will you prepare this year? My suggestion is to pick up a new spiritual practice this Advent. Maybe that means finding an Advent devotional book, or website like www.d365.org, to read each day. If you have never done anything like that before, I encourage you to try reading scripture and spending time with God each day this Advent—I think you will be surprised by the results! Or, maybe you could keep a prayer journal during Advent and write down your joys, concerns, and answered prayers each day? For those of you who enjoy photography and social media, I encourage you to be part of our FUPCDC Advent Photo Challenge (see the instructions in this newsletter). Whatever you chose to do, I hope it will prepare your heart, mind, and soul to welcome the Christ child.

Furthermore, a calendar of special events and opportunities available at First United Presbyterian Church of Dale City for the Advent/Christmas season can be found in this newsletter. I hope that you will be able to attend many of these events, and that you will invite your friends and neighbors to come with you. This Advent and Christmas, let us rejoice in the presence of the Light of our Lord Jesus Christ in our lives, and let us share that Light with all whom we meet!

New Pastor - Reverend Adam C. Bowling

First United Presbyterian Church of Dale City (FUPCDC), Virginia voted on September 30, 2018 to call the Rev. Adam C. Bowling as their next installed pastor. Rev. Bowling recently served First Presbyterian Church in Morganton, NC as their Associate Pastor for over 11 years. In Morganton, Rev. Bowling oversaw a robust children's ministry program which included a week-long, full-day summer Bible Camp for over 118 children. He also ministered to hundreds of youth who attended programming, Bible studies, mission opportunities, and conference trips. He led five international mission trips with Son Servants to locations in Mexico, Central America, and the Caribbean. In Morganton, Pastor Bowling also helped start a monthly communion service at a local nursing home for individuals in a skilled care unit.

The Rev. Adam C. Bowling graduated *summa cum laude* from Hampden-Sydney College in Farmville, VA with a B.S. in Biology and Religion in 2003. He then studied at Union Presbyterian Seminary in Richmond, VA, where he earned his Master's of Divinity and a Master of Arts in Christian Education in 2007. While in Richmond, Rev. Bowling worked for Camp Hanover, the Presbytery of the James, and Bon Air Presbyterian Church in Chesterfield, VA. The Rev. Bowling was ordained a Minister of the Word and Sacrament in the Presbyterian Church (USA) on August 19, 2007.

Adam met his wife, Erin, at Camp Hanover, a Presbyterian Camp and Conference Center in Hanover County, VA. Erin is an elementary school teacher who graduated from the College of William & Mary, and they have three children: Parker (age 11), Chase (age 9), and Lily Paige (6 months). They look forward to moving to Virginia to be closer to family.

Adam's first Sunday in the pulpit at First United Presbyterian Church of Dale City will be Sunday, December 2, 2018. The church has a Traditional Worship Service at 8:30 AM, Christian Education for all ages at 9:45 AM, and a Contemporary Worship Service at 11:00 AM. All are welcome to attend! The church will have a special combined service on Sunday, December 16 at 10:00 AM for a music cantata featuring Christmas and Advent songs. FUPCDC offers three services on Christmas Eve; a Child Friendly Christmas Eve Service at 4:00 PM, a Candlelight Communion Service at 7:30 PM, and a Contemplative Candlelight Communion Service at 9:30 PM. Session Report - November 2018

November Session Report

At its meeting on November 20th, the Session approved the Deacons providing a meal for the Hilda Barg Homeless Shelter on December 21st Watch the bulletin for information as to how you can help.

We heard from Stewardship that 83 pledges have been received so far for \$316.000.00 pledged for the 2019 budget. Pledge cards are available in the Narthex for those who have not yet turned in their planned pledge. Our goal is to have 100% of the congregation submitting a pledge, even if it is for a small amount. We are looking for commitment.

Building and Grounds is in the last stages of a final walk through on the roof replacement with a punch list to be created for anything remaining to be completed. We have been very blessed that the insurance will be covering the majority of the expense of this improvement. and that we were able to use shingles with a 50-year expected life.

Funding for the new Safety and Security Committee was approved, as was an amended Fund raising Policy. The Emergency Action Plan was approved on the second reading.

Children's Ministry will be bringing healthy food items for the ACTS pantry during the month of December.

We are pleased that our Record and Minutes books were approved without exception this month, thanks to help from Kim, Pastor Jeri, and several of the elders with specific actions needed to comply with Presbytery and Book of Order requirements.

Deacons Report - November 2018

Deacons provided support and donations of food for Blessings of the Church on 9/22.

Deacons provided donations of food for Men's Retreat on 9/29.

Deacons hosted Trunk or Treat event on 10/28. Over 200 from community attended. Lots of happy children and parents. We had 14 participate in the trunk portion (Deacons/Congregation members and friends/Little Hands/Scout parents). Scouts, Church Prayer table, and Little Hands Preschool were ever present. The church served hot dogs, chips, and water (purchased enough for 240). Thanks to Sam Parris, Jon Guest, Celine Sonkwa, and Liz Glyer for working the grill goodies. Leftover chips (50 bags) and one case of water went to Lumberton with the Mission Team. Leftover hot dogs (40) will go to Spread the Bread on 12/9.

Deacons (and congregation) supported Stephen Addo funeral and reception on 11/10. We expected upwards of 250 people. Leftover food was distributed as follows: Speaker series (11/10); Deacon coffee (11/12); Spread the Bread (11/12); Fruit and veggie tray to Grace's House for reception on 11/12; and non-perishable items will be used at Pastor's farewell. Nothing went unused!

Mayra and Gretchen discussed their food donation (tacos) to the Beverly Warren Shelter on 11/13. There were 7 adults and 7 children. Gretchen provided a list of supplies that she donated as well. The shelter provides a safe place to stay for the night or even a few weeks for those facing homelessness, eviction, living in a car or on the street or living in other housing which has been deemed unsuitable for human habitation. Deacons can now reach out to families for support of this effort. If you are so inclined to help with the meal, contact your Deacon. The next meal will be served on 12/11.

Deacons hosted and supported Potluck Breakfast on 11/18 as part of the farewell celebrations for Pastor Jeri.

Un-Trim-A-Tree kicked off on 11/24 and runs through 12/16 with gift drop-offs by 12/16. Watch for bulletin announcements.






New Bible Study Beginning Sunday, January 6, 2019, at 9:45 in Room 22:

Connection strategies including inspecting and dismantling our biases, intentionally seeking unfamiliar people to reach out to, and learning a foreign language.


Inclusion stories from multiple cultures.

There will only be one service on December 16th. We will celebrate Christ's birth on the 23rd, and on the 30th we will talk about a prophecy fulfilled in Christ's birth! Join us during this most holy season!



Yucatan Mission Trip Update November 2018

We are busy preparing for our January 2019 mission trip to the village of Cinco de Mayo in the Yucatan. Cinco de Mayo is a small village located near Veracruz, a village where we worked for several years installing one of our three water purification plants. We met many of the people of Cinco de Mayo over the years while we were working in Veracruz because their children attended the bible school we were providing to the children in Veracruz. There is also a close relationship between the two villages as the leader of the Veracruz Presbyterian Church and the leader of the Cinco de Mayo Presbyterian Mission are sisters!

On this trip we will be helping our Presbyterian brothers and sisters in Cinco de Mayo build their new church (primarily focusing on installing a cement floor) and we will be providing a bible study for the adults and a bible school for the children. The team is busy working on the bible school curriculum and we are in the process of gathering the materials we will need for the cement floor.

In January we will be asking the congregation to help supply the toys and school materials we want to take with us for the bible school. We will have the items we need on the tree of hope in the Narthex the first two weeks in January. We will provide another update in December.


New Security Devices



You may have seen one or more dome cameras placed both inside and outside of the church, they are part of a phased installation of an updated security system for the church. The primary focus areas for the cameras are main entrances and hallways. Signs will be placed at the church entrances indicating that a camera system also referred to as a Closed-Circuit Television (CCTV) System is in use.

It would be nice to think that security systems, including video surveillance systems, are not needed for public places including churches, but unfortunately, recent events have shown that these sacred places are not exempt from danger. Churches, just like any other establishment, need to protect the people and property and one of the best ways to help secure these places of worship is using a quality video surveil-lance system with indoor and outdoor security cameras. The recommendation to deploy a camera system was one of several improvement to the FUPCDC security posture based on a review by Prince William County Police Department.

The information captured by this system is restricted and stored for about 30 days and automatically purged. If you have additional questions or would like more information please email security@fupcdc.org or see Chris Martin or Jon Guest.

This project is more about the practice of paying attention and being intentional than using the right filter or getting the perfect shot — though we totally encourage you to get creative! Let this be an intentional time — even for a few minutes a day — to pause, remember, and reflect. May your Advent season be intentional, thought provoking, and filled with the hope of Christ. 


