
You are ready for new leadership. During this time of interim/transitional ministry, you have become a vital congregation and I am excited for the new opportunities that await you.

Introducing PCUSA's New Hymnal Glory to God

Hymnal to be dedicated October 28th

It was 1990 when the blue hymnal replaced the 1955 old red hymnal that many of you may remember; and many thought, "I will never like this new blue hymnal." But people came to love it and became excited about the introduction of several new hymns. And then in 2013 our denomination released another new hymnal: *Glory to God*.

In 2015 a generous donation provided 20 copies of Glory to God for the choir to use and the *Glory to God Projection* issue that is used during both services when hymns and songs are used from *Glory to God*. And now in 2018 a decision has been made to adopt and use the *Glory to God* hymnal. These hymnals have been purchased from a restricted fund given by an anonymous donor to enhance ministry here at the church. What an exciting way to enhance ministry: singing to the glory of God during worship from the new *Glory to God* hymnal. WOW!

Here's the good news, many of your favorite hymns/songs are included in the new hymnal. *Glory to God* includes 853 hymns of which approximately 400 of the 600 hymns from the blue hymnal are included. Also, there are several hymns from the old red hymnal that were eliminated in the blue hymnal that are now included in the denomination's most recent hymnal: *Glory to God*.

Some old favorites now included in *Glory to God* are *Rock of Ages, Cleft for Me, Just a Closer Walk with Thee, It Is Well with My Soul, Shall We Gather at the River, How Can I Keep from Singing? and Mine Eyes Have Seen the Glory (of the Coming of the Lord).*

Here's some additional information about the new hymnal.

- There are 30 pages of liturgy in the front of the book that follow Reformed worship practices.
- Many of the contemporary worship songs that have been and continue to be popular are now
 included in this hymnal. The church has a CCLI license so will continue to introduce quality,
 theologically sound new contemporary worship songs you hear on Christian radio stations.
- Glory to God includes sing-able Psalms and enough music for a complete Taizé service.
- While there are more pages in the new hymnal, thanks to technology and paper that weighs less, it weighs approximately the same as the blue one.

These new hymnals will be dedicated on Sunday, October 28th during both services. So, what happens to the blue hymnals? First, you are offered the opportunity to take a copy, as long as they last, for your personal use or to give to someone. Thirty copies will be maintained by the church so favorites not included in the new hymnal may be sung during worship without infringing upon copyright laws. Second, any remaining copies will be made available to places that may not have access to any hymnals. For example, hymnals may be donated to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) for churches affected by disasters that have occurred during fires, flood's hurricanes, or tornadoes.

What can we say? To God be the glory, as we sing from *Glory to God*! Amen and Amen! Praise the Lord!


November 10th:

Little Hands Preschool




Dear First United Presbyterian Church of Dale City,




Thank You from Alex Butler

As you may or may not know, on Sunday, September 2nd I was at both services, feeling just fine...well, maybe a little tired. By 4 AM on Labor Day, I was in the ER at Mount Vernon Hospital. I had a white cell count of 27,000, was septic, and they had no idea why. A CAT-SCAN and sonogram of my gallbladder were both inconclusive and I was asked if I wanted them to remove it. It was my decision. It was as if God put the words in my mouth to remove it. I am so very thankful it was removed because in the words of the surgeon, "We removed a very, very, very angry gangrene gallbladder." I was hospitalized for 6 days. I am humbled by the experience and very thankful to be alive and to experience the miraculous healing that has and is occurring within my body. To God be the glory!

Words cannot fully express my sincere thanks and deep appreciation for your prayers, cards, flowers, texts, phone calls, and emails; and yes, even the foxes. I truly felt embraced by your prayers, love, care, and support throughout my recent medical ordeal. I am humbled by the experience and am so very thankful to be among the living. More than ever I understand the peace of Christ that surpasses all understanding, as I never felt a moment of fear or anxiety. To God be the glory! I am also most appreciative of the way the Session and others of you made sure everything continued as planned in my absence. This is a positive sign that you understand that you are the church.
