The church is not a building; the church is not a steeple; the church is not a resting place; the church is a people.
I am the church! You are the church! We are the church together!
All who follow Jesus, all around the world!
Yes, we're the church together!

Yes, we're the church together. Yes, you are a part of a particular church near the intersection of Cardinal and Minnieville. Yes, God is calling YOU and YOU and YOU to be part of the body of Christ, to love and serve the LORD, to worship and praise and give thanks to the ONE who loves you more than you can ever imagine, who will never forsake you.


Wednesday Night Alive

Jerry Matali








