MESSAGE FROM PASTOR JERI



DISASTERS AND EMERGENCIES CAN AND DO HAPPEN WITHOUT WARNING! HOW READY ARE YOU?

The last week in August many of us watched the devastation of Hurricane Harvey as this catastrophic storm made landfall in the area of Houston and moved westward into Louisiana dropping 50 inches of rain in some areas. And now, out in the Atlantic Ocean, Irma is approaching with the possibility of making landfall in the southeast or maybe even the East Coast.

Disasters and emergencies can and do happen without warning! How prepared ae you and your family for a disaster?

- How many of you have a family emergency plan?
- How will contact be made among your family members during and after an emergency?
- Do you have enough non-perishable food and water for five days? This includes one gallon of water per person per day.
- Do you have important documents and papers that are password protected on a flash drive or stored in a cloud?
- Do you have emergency kits for the home, office, and car? If so, do you check the expiration dates of the contents every 6 months? Do you know the recommended contents for each kit?
- Do you know how to respond if disaster impacts your home or workplace? Your child(ren)'s school(s)?
- What if the church is impacted? Check ABC and FOX News for scrolling information; the church's website, Facebook page, and *fupcdc kidz church* on another Facebook site; look for messages from your Deacon. Of course, all this means there must be electrical power. If you have a cell phone number for texting, that would be helpful. Please call Kim at the Church Office (703-670-7834) to share this information.

DISASTER PREPARATION continued

As some of you know, I serve as a Chaplain for the Fairfax County Office of Emergency Management and the Fairfax County Police Department. I am most appreciative for the training I have received in the area of disaster preparedness. Over the last few years, I have seen the impact on individuals and families when disaster and emergencies have occurred with and without warning; disasters such as:

- House and apartment fires
- Flooding of communities where people had massive cleanups and/or were not permitted to return to their homes for several days
- Earthquake damage
- Snowmageddon
- Threats of terrorism, including 9/11 and the sniper shootings
- Hurricanes and tornadoes in the Northern Virginia area and Maryland
- The Navy Yard shooting
- Train, and Metro-Rail accidents—and while not present, more than once a plane has crashed into the Potomac River.

In the DC Metropolitan area we laugh and run to the store at the threat of the first snowflake, It *might* snow means shelves containing milk, bread, toilet paper, and adult beverages are quickly emptied.

Friends, since we live in an area where natural and humankind disasters occur, the question is not IF a disaster or emergency will occur, the question is WHEN will it occur and will you be ready?

In my times spent on call and working disaster situations, one thing has become very clear to me: one's ability to cope during a disaster or an emergency is related to two very specific areas: 1} one's level of preparation and 2) one's faith and relationship with the Lord.

May you and your family be prepared for the inevitable. May you continue to grow and mature in your faith. God bless you. If you would like to discuss Disaster Preparedness in greater depth, let's do so.


