Jesus said, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives.

Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid." ~ John 14:27

You are given a blank sheet of paper. Draw a picture that depicts peace.

A story is told about a King who decided to offer a prize to an artist who could best depict peace. Many entered the contest and the King narrowed the selection down to two pieces of artwork.

One picture was a calm lake mirroring the surrounding mountains. The sky was blue and the clouds were white and billowy. Those who looked at the King's choices described how a sense of peace came over them as they admired this artist's piece of work.

The other piece of artwork also included mountains, but the perspective was quite different. Instead of tall majestic mountains, these mountains were rugged, lacking the lush greenness of the other picture. Instead of a blue sky with white clouds, the sky was dark and angry looking with bolts of lightning flashing in the background. A waterfall plummeted down the side of the mountain from heavy rains.

Initially, the King saw only the effects of the storm; but as he looked more closely, he made a discovery. Behind the waterfall was a small bush growing between the cracks of the rock. In the bush was a mother bird sitting on her nest ever so calm in the midst of the storm.

Which picture would you have chosen and why? What brings you peace? Where do you look for peace? How do you express peace? Experience peace?

Which picture did the King choose? The second one. Why? As he looked at the first picture, he experienced a sense of tranquility; but as he looked at the second picture he began to realize that peace is more than tranquility.

He realized that peace does not mean to be in a place where there is no noise, trouble, or hard work. Peace means to be in the midst of all those things and still be calm in your heart. (story by Catherine Marshall) In this day and age when life is chaotic, when situations all around us are filled with turmoil and anger and violence, when things are not going the way you hoped, may you experience the peace that Christ offers – a true peace, an inner peace of calmness that is found even in the midst of the difficult and trying times in life.

Children's Ministry

We hope everyone is enjoying their Summer vacation! We completed a wonderful, fun and amazing Vacation Bible School. The children and volunteers learned how dangerous it could be to follow Jesus in the early church.

Your children's ministry team will meet on August 20th to discuss and prepare for when Kidz Church resumes on **Sunday, September 3rd at 9:45 AM & 11:00 AM**. There are some changes that you will need to know:

Children's Choir: will no longer meet the 1st and 2nd Sunday of each month. **New rehearsal date will be every Thursday at 6:00 PM.** There will be more information provided when there are more details. Children's choir is open to children age 4-10 (Pre-K - 5th grade).

Nursery: will be available for children infant to early three's (not quite potty-trained). During the church calendar year, when one service is scheduled, children up to five will join Ms. Joann and Ms. Becky in the Nursery. Children six and up will join parents for the worship service. Worship bags are available in the Narthex.

9:45 AM class: will be available for children Kindergarten (age 5) - Fifth grade. Children infant through 4 years old will join Ms. Joann in the Nursery. Volunteers may be needed during the 9:45 AM education hour and 11:00 AM worship hour. Please see Ms, Joann, Nursery Supervisor, if you are willing to help, or if she is in need of help.

Kidz Church School Year 2017-18: All children must be registered for the school year. Whether your child(ren) have been with us for awhile or children are joining us for the first time, a form must be filled out each year. There could be updated information that we should be made aware. Forms will be available on Sunday, September 3rd.


