### **MESSAGE FROM PASTOR JERI**



Let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, <sup>2</sup> fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. ~Hebrews 12:1b-2

Manteo Mitchell felt the pop in his leg and knew it wasn't good. "It felt like somebody literally just snapped my leg in half," he said. The American sprinter had half a lap left to run in the first leg of the 4x400-meter relay preliminaries. When he felt his leg pop, he had a choice: to keep running or stop and lose the race.

To him, it was never much of a choice. He finished the lap and limped to the side to watch the Americans finish the race and qualify easily for the final. A few hours later, doctors confirmed what he suspected: He had run the last half-lap with a broken left fibula. (ABC News)

Oscar Pistorius, known as "Blade Man", is a South African sprinter who was born without fibulas. At the age of 11 months he had both legs amputated just below the knee. Pistorius, who attempted to enter the 2008 Olympics in Beijing, was denied an opportunity to run because the international governing body for track ruled his prosthetic legs allegedly gave him a biomechanical advantage in the races. Pistorius appealed the ruling to the Court of Arbitration for Sport, which ruled in early 2008 that he was eligible to compete in the Olympics. Disappointed because he missed qualifying for Beijing by 0.7 seconds, Pistorius continued to improve his times and qualified for London, racing in the 400 meters.

Mitchell and Pistorius are but two of many examples of what can happen when one runs with perseverance the race that is set before them.

You and I have a *life-saving* race set before us: to look to Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of our faith. I wonder how many of us are running with perseverance the race that is set before us.

To run such a race requires commitment, dedication, and sacrifice. Now is the time to put on your track shoes and enter the race of a lifetime. Speed is not as much of a factor as commitment is. May you begin to think about your commitment to Jesus Christ. The race is set before you. What will your track record be?

Grace and peace for the journey ahead of you as you move forward towards the PNC identifying a person to present to you as your next installed pastor.

### **Parish Associates**

### **Parish Associate Relationships**

Several of you have asked what it means to be a parish associate. The following includes the wording from National Capital Presbytery's policy.

A parish associate is a specialized minister who wishes to maintain a relationship with a particular church or churches in keeping with ordination to the ministry of the Word and Sacrament. Such persons, already qualified as members of presbytery, may serve as parish associates.

The annual relationship shall be established, upon nomination by the installed or temporary pastor (i.e. Pastor Jeri as your Pastor for Interim Ministry), between the parish associate, the session, and the presbytery. The parish associate shall be responsible to the installed or temporary pastor, as head of staff, and may serve on an "as needed, and available" basis without remuneration. Parish associates can receive honoraria for specific tasks.

As a congregation, you are blessed that Larry Greenslit is a Parish Associate at FUPCDC. He has a very special gift of teaching and has been actively involved in teaching Adult Sunday School. People really enjoy his classes and he is a definite asset to the Adult Education program. He does not receive honoraria for the specific task of teaching.

A parish associate may not be called to be the next installed pastor or associate pastor of a church served as parish associate, unless at least one year has elapsed since the end of the parish associate relationship.

The annual agreement between the session, the parish associate, and the presbytery shall terminate when the call to the installed or temporary pastor is dissolved. The presbytery may dissolve the relationship with the parish associate upon the recommendation of the session and its moderator and a vote from the Coordinating Commission of the Committee on Ministry.

What this means is that when your next installed pastor is called, Larry's relationship as a Parish Associate will be dissolved. The installed pastor may or may not decide to continue Larry's relationship as a Parish Associate. Whatever that decision may be, the Adult Education Committee may continue to invite Larry to teach classes.






